RESOLUTION OF THE SOLANO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RECOGNIZING JOSHUA WHITE, MEMBER OF BOY SCOUT TROOP 488 IN VACAVILLE, CALIFORNIA ON ACHIEVING THE EAGLE SCOUT AWARD

WHEREAS, on August 3, 2015 Joshua White attended the Eagle Scout Court of Honor to commemorate his Eagle Scout achievement. Eagle Scout is the highest award a scout can receive and represents many years of dedicated effort. Eagle Scout is a demonstration of leadership, citizenship and responsibility; and


WHEREAS, earning the rank of Eagle Scout is not an easy task. An Eagle Scout project must be completed. Scouts are required to earn at least 21 merit badges, including: First Aid, Citizenship in the Community, Citizenship in the Nation, Citizenship in the World, Communications, Environmental Science, Personal Fitness, Camping, Family Life, Personal Management, Emergency Preparedness or Lifesaving and Hiking. They must serve six months in a troop leadership position; plan, develop, and give leadership to a service project for any religious organization or any school or community; and finally take part in a Scoutmaster conference and successfully completed an Eagle Scout board of review; and

WHEREAS, Joshua built and installed a 60ft long boardwalk on Bobcat Trail at Solano County Land Trust in Lynch Canyon for his Eagle Scout Project. The 60ft boardwalk will allow hikers to walk the trail safely during the rainy season. Joshua has spent 64 nights camping, hiked 93 miles, and served 112 hours of community service. As a Cub Scout, Joshua earned all 20 activity badges and Cub Scouting's highest honor, the Arrow of Light. As a Troop Youth Leader, he has served in several leadership positions that include Assistant Patrol Leader, Patrol Leader and Instructor. Joshua has earned 38 Merit Badges and the NOA Camping Award.


