



Achieving the Proposed Service Model

SB 1379 created an exception for hours worked by a retired person hired by the Sheriff's Office in the capacity of Deputy Sheriff, Evidence Technician and Communication Operator. The bill limits the number of appointments to 20 retired annuitants. SB 1379 sunsets on January 1, 2027.

The proposed service model consists of the following 17.0 full-time employees (FTE's) covering half of Vallejo from 1200 - 2400, 7 days per week:

- ➤ 1.0 FTE Lieutenant-Sheriff
- ➤ 2.0 FTE Sergeant- Sheriff

- ➤ 12.0 FTE Deputy-Sheriff
- ➤ 2.0 FTE Public Safety Dispatchers
- Sheriff's Office would recruit, test, and select interested full-time Sergeant-Sheriffs and Deputy-Sheriff's pursuant to the Deputy Sheriff's Association Units 3 & 4 MOUs and assign those selected to service the contract.
- Sheriff's Office would hire up to 20 retired annuitants in the Deputy-Sheriff and Dispatch classifications to backfill the proposed service model.
- Retired annuitant Deputy-Sheriffs would be assigned to the Court Services bureau to work in full-time assignments.
- Crime Analysis would be utilized to capture data for the purpose of strategic operation utilization and reporting.



Next Steps



Key Issues to be addressed in negotiations

- Vallejo to confirm with DOJ, in writing, that the Sheriff's Office is not subject to the settlement agreement.
- Vallejo to meet and confer with Vallejo Police Officer's Association.
- Meet and confer with Deputy Sheriff's Association and Service Employees International Union.

Receive initial start-up payment, estimated at \$3,372,395 for equipment, insurance and liability from the City of Vallejo within 15 days of contract execution.

Contract service preparation, to include:

- Work with General Services Purchasing to complete equipment purchases.
- Work with General Services Fleet to complete vehicle purchases and outfitting.
- Work with DoIT Communications to develop cost estimate to resolve Dispatch communications technology hurdles.
- Work with DoIT to implement crime analysis software.
- Work with Human Resources to recruit, select, complete backgrounds, and hire retired annuitants.
- Complete internal selection process to assign staff to Vallejo.



Critical Timeline Issues



- Contract presented for Board Approval no later than June 24, 2025.
 - Approved by Vallejo City Council prior to Board approval.
- Start up payment must be received within 15 days of contract execution estimated no later than July 9, 2025.
- Hire Retired Annuitants by December 7, 2025 pay period.
- Receive all equipment and Fleet purchases prior to January launch date.
- Launch Services in Vallejo by January 2026.

If a contract is not approved by this date, the Sheriff will not have adequate time to hire the necessary staff and procure all equipment in order to deliver a one-year service contract prior to the sunset of SB 1379 on January 1, 2027.



Sheriff Request



The Sheriff requests that the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Receive an informational presentation on the Sheriff Office's ability to provide temporary law enforcement assistance to the City of Vallejo; and
- Provide direction to the Sheriff regarding whether to proceed with contract discussions to provide temporary law enforcement assistance to the City of Vallejo.
