## **RESOLUTION OF THE SOLANO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RECOGNIZING WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 11, 2026, AS “211 DAY” IN SOLANO COUNTY**

**WHEREAS**, 211 is a free, confidential service available 24/7 that connects individuals and families to the essential resources and services they need, including assistance with housing, food, healthcare, and transportation; and

**WHEREAS**, the 211 service is celebrated nationwide on February 11th each year as a reminder of the essential role 211 plays in supporting communities and connecting people to vital resources; and

**WHEREAS**, the 211 network includes over 200 agencies across the United States, who work tirelessly to assist millions of people each year, making it easier to find help in times of need; and

**WHEREAS**, 211 specialists are trained to provide compassionate, expert guidance in finding local support, empowering individuals to navigate challenging circumstances and access life-changing resources; and

**WHEREAS**, 211 Bay Area plays a critical role in disaster response, providing timely and accurate information to Solano County residents affected by natural disasters, public health emergencies, and other crises; and

**WHEREAS**, on this day, we recognize the incredible impact 211 Bay Area has had in our community, helping 18,663 residents receive 32,198 referrals in 2025 to the services and support they need to stay housed, meet their basic needs, and access vital community resources.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Solano County Board of Supervisors hereby recognizes February 11, 2026, as 211 Day in Solano County and encourages all residents to learn more about the resources available through 211 Bay Area and to use the service when in need.
