Youth Population to be Served

These services are to be available for enrolled in-school and out-of-school program participants. The basic WIOA Youth Grant eligibility is as follows.

At least 75% of the WIOA Youth Grant funds must be expend on out-of school youth. Thus the program enrolls a high percentage as out-of-school youth.

Delivery of Services

All three of these services may become a component of an enrolled youth's customized employment plan. Tutoring is a most important component given: a) many youth's need for academic remediation; and b) the program's need to meet a critical WIOA Youth Grant performance standard - to raise enrolled youths' attainment of a credential or degree.

Each youth is assessed by a WDB Youth Employability Specialist at point of enrollment as to his/her academic standing and need for assistance in attaining the goal of completing high school or gaining an equivalency (such as passing the multi-part GED test.) A tutoring component is then discussed with the youth and built in to his/her employment plan. These youth are then referred to the tutoring provider.

Leadership training and financial literacy training are available for all youth. These are built in to each youth's employment plan as well.

Total Youth Served in 2016-17 Program: 55 participants

Tutoring: 18 participants Leadership Training: 30 participants Financial Literacy Training: 30 participants

The services will be offered in the following sites throughout the county. The hours that such services will be available include the following.

Hours are set to accommodate school schedules and/or consideration of travel time to the sites. Individual appointments and group sessions are offered for youth.
