November 3, 2020 – Update from ROV

- ROV Recommendation:

 - Approve Contract for COVID Grant
 - Approve ROV Expenditure Increase for FY20/21 for COVID expenses.



November 3, 2020 – ROV Plan

- No Contact Voting:
 - 100% of voters will receive vote-by-mail ballots;
- Limited Contact Voting:
 - 15 locations for 30-day ballot drop-off
 - Up from 8 locations in March.
 - 10 locations for 5-day curbside drop-off;
 - Up from 3 locations in March.
- Traditional In-Person Voting:
 - 100 in-person Election Day polling places;
 - Up from 92 locations in March.



November 3, 2020 – ROV Current Plan



30-day drop off locations (3x Fairfield, Vallejo, Vacaville; 1x Benicia, Dixon, Rio Vista, Suisun, Travis, ROV Office)

5-day drop curbside drop off (2x Fairfield, Vallejo, Vacaville; 1x Benicia, Dixon, Rio Vista, Suisun)

- Election Day Poll Places
 - 6 Benicia;
 - 4 Dixon;
 - 2 Rio Vista;
- 22 Fairfield;
- 5 Suisun;
- 28 Vacaville;
- 33 Vallejo



November 3, 2020 – Ballot Status

- Recommending consolidation of Districts in Election
- 195 unique ballot types due to local election variation
- 12 Statewide measures on all ballots

Overlay of Districts causes multiple ballot types.





November 3, 2020 – Hiring Status

- Office Full-Time Staff
 - One Vacancy
- Office Extra Help Staff
 - Inventory Clerk Fully Staffed
 - Election Tech 85% Staffed (expect 100% by Sept. 5)
- Pollworkers (as of July 30)
 - 35 "Adopted Locations" Fully Staffed
 - 32 Non-Adopted Locations Fully Staffed
 - 33 Non-Adopted Locations Partially Staffed
 - Expect 100% staffed by Aug. 29 (1100 pollworkers)



November 3, 2020 – Contingency Planning

- COVID-19 Polling Site Contingencies
 - Pre-planned locations to move to should any polling place need to close without warning
 - Added new polling sites in case we experience COVID related last minute closures
- PSPS Contingencies
 - 7 with generated power in case of a PSPS even on Nov 3rd
 - Vallejo Solano County Fairground Benicia Senior Center
 - Fairfield Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Dixon Moose Lodge
 - Suisun City Kroc Center
- **Rio Vista** Trilogy Club House

- Vacaville Mission Church
- Backup tabulation site with generated power in case of PSPS



November 3, 2020 – Election day security



- You must be an active registered voter to vote without producing ID – inactive voters do no receive ballots
- Tabulation computers and polling place equipment not connected to the internet
- Ballot preparation room secured from tabulation room
- Polling place poll books pre-loaded with register no updates to centralized system until after the election



November 3, 2020 – Ballot security

- Incoming Vote by Mail Ballot Handling Checkpoints:
 - Stage 1 Valid Envelope Correct Election, Valid Voter for the election
 - Stage 2 Valid Signature Voter Signature must match registration record
 - <u>Stage 3 Voter Eligibility</u> Envelope compared to current voter status voter hasn't moved, hasn't voted in the state, hasn't been issued other ballots.
 - Stage 4 Valid Envelope contents one valid ballot submitted per envelope
 - <u>Stage 5 Final Balance/Tabulate Ballot</u> Quantity of Envelopes Received/approved balanced to ballots counted.

Recent history of Invalid Ballots

- Anticipate return of ~198,000 Vote by Mail Ballots out of ~246,000 eligible
- March 2020 111,578 ballots cast 4 deemed invalid/not processed
- Last Presidential election 170,628 cast 11 deemed invalid/not processed

November 3, 2020 – ROV Plan

- ROV COVID Grant awarded \$897,948.
- Reimbursable expenses will include:
 - All Pollworkers: face shields/masks/gloves
 - Poll Place Check-in Stations: Additional Sneeze Guards
 - Sanitizing and Cleaning between voters
 - Disposable items (pens, ballot secrecy sleeves, etc.)
 - VBM processing modifications for social distancing
 - Equipment for Staff sanitizing stations
 - Extra Staff/Pollworker hours/quantities.



Concluding – Board action

Key election metrics:

- September 28-30 ballots mailed to active registered voters
- October 20 first permitted date to process ballots tabulation results secured until Nov 3rd
- Ballots postmarked by November 3rd or dropped of before 8pm November 3rd will be processed
- Polling Places open from 7am 8pm

- Approve Request for Consolidation of Election
- Approve Contract for COVID Grant Funding
- Approve ROV Expenditure Increase for FY20/21 for COVID expenses.

Voting Options for November
