

**SECOND AMENDMENT TO
SOLANO COUNTY STANDARD CONTRACT #2018-401**

This Second Amendment to Solano County Standard Contract #2018-401 ("Second Amendment"), is entered into as of July 1, 2019, between the County of Solano, a political subdivision of the State of California, for the benefit of First 5 Solano Children and Families Commission, ("Commission"), and Parents by Choice ("Contractor").

1. Recitals

- A. The parties entered into that certain Solano County Standard Contract known as contract #2018-401 dated July 1, 2018 ("Agreement"), for Contractor to provide Triple P parenting education services; and
- B. The parties amended the Agreement on March 1, 2019 to amend the activities and allowable expenses per deliverables without increasing the total compensation; and
- C. Commission and Contractor now desire to amend the Agreement a second time as set forth below.

2. Agreement

- A. Section 2 of the Agreement is deleted and replaced in its entirety with the following:
 - The Term of this Contract is July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2020
- B. Section 3 of the Agreement is deleted and replaced in its entirety with the following:
 - The maximum amount of this Contract is \$519,400 total:
 - Up to \$250,000 for the period of 7/1/2018 – 6/30/2019 for Triple P services and activities
 - Up to \$269,400 for the period of 7/1/2019 – 6/30/2020 for Triple P services and activities
- C. Scope of Work (Exhibit A-1) is deleted and replaced in its entirety with Exhibit A-2, which is attached to and incorporated into this Second Amendment.
- D. Exhibit B-1 is deleted and replaced with Exhibit B-2 which is attached to and incorporated into this Second Amendment.

3. Effectiveness of the Contract

Except as expressly set forth in this Second Amendment, the terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain unchanged.

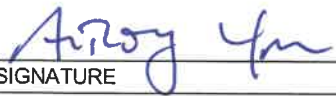
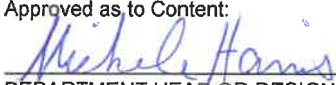
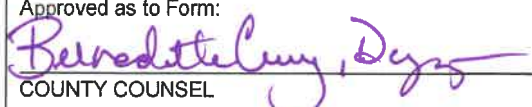

Should unforeseen expenses arise, Contractor may propose a budget modification which will require written agreement from First 5 Solano. In no event shall total contract amount exceed \$269,400.
