RESOLUTION OF THE SOLANO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER 2023 AS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH IN SOLANO COUNTY

WHEREAS, Domestic Violence is a pattern of abusive and threatening behaviors perpetrated by an intimate partner or family member against another; and the crime of domestic violence violates an individual's privacy, dignity, security and humanity due to the systematic use of physical, emotional, sexual, psychological and economic control and/or abuse; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence is a prevalent social problem significantly impacting the health and well-being of Solano residents; and it impacts people of all genders, sexual orientations, ages, racial, ethnic, cultural, social, religious, and economic groups in California and here in Solano County; and

WHEREAS, 24 people per minute are victims of rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner in the United States — more than 12 million women and men over the course of a year. One in three female homicide victims are murdered by their current or former partner every year. An estimated 3.3 million children are exposed to violence by family members; these children suffer deep and lasting emotional effects and are more likely to continue the cycle of abuse from one generation to the next; and

WHEREAS, Solano County law enforcement agencies received 2,041 domestic violence related calls for assistance in 2022, 1,020 of which involved weapons and 228 were strangulation incidents; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors recognizes the importance of supporting countywide efforts to reduce incidents of domestic violence in our community and has supported local efforts to interrupt the generational cycle of violence, including the Solano Family Justice Center. The Solano Family Justice Center, as a model program designed to reduce barriers for victims seeking services, is a warm and welcoming one-stop center where multiple co-located direct-service partners provide a full range of trauma-informed services for children, youth and adults affected by domestic violence; and


WHEREAS, since the passage of the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) 29 years ago, our awareness and response to domestic violence has greatly improved. What was too often seen as a private matter best hidden behind closed doors is now an established issue of local and national concern. Laws have changed, our culture transformed, and support services for survivors have improved. We continue our efforts to provide protection and justice for survivors and to prevent violence from occurring. During Domestic Violence Awareness Month, we stand with domestic abuse survivors ensuring their voices are heard and shedding light in this important issue; and

WHEREAS, this October, let us honor Domestic Violence Awareness Month by promoting peace in our own families, homes, and communities. Let us renew our commitment to end domestic violence -- in every corner of Solano County.


