Dear Supervisor Mashburn,

I am writing to you on behalf of Caymus Vineyards (Caymus-Suisun Winery) and Chuck Wagner, who is currently on a business trip to the East Coast. As many of our vintners and growers know, December is an opportune time to travel on business or pleasure with harvest completed. Unfortunately, the result is that many of the stakeholders in Suisun Valley are unavailable to attend tomorrow's Board Meeting, which includes two items of interest to us all.

The two items are:

Item 35 : Receive a presentation on the development of the Integrated Water Resources Framework (One Water Framework) funded with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

Item 36 : The Department of Resource Management recommends that the Board of Supervisors receive a presentation from staff on continued discussion on issues identification for the County's General Plan update with an emphasis on economic development.

Each of these items contains subject matter which will impact the Suisun Valley in important ways. We have been meeting with County staff to discuss these matters and to try and get definitive answers to some of our concerns. We need more time to conclude those conversations if we are to support these measures before the Board.

In addition, there is also an interim Interchange Study Background Report (November 2024) which we just discovered last week. We need that report to be agendaized for discussion by the Board so that stakeholders may express concerns and make suggestions for improvements in the implicit direction of the study.

Respectfully, we are asking that the two agenda items be deferred until your second meeting in January to allow time for stakeholder review and comment. Alternatively, if you want to open the hearing for testimony tomorrow, then we ask that you continue the open hearing to the second meeting in January.

Additionally, we ask that the interim Interchange Study background report be agendaized for discussion at that same January Board meeting for stakeholder input and comment.

The Suisun Valley wine industry is excited about continuing to build a robust destination for food and wine experiences here in Suisun. We have only just begun. I will share with you that Dr. Robert Eyster conducted an economic impact study of the Caymus operations in Solano County. The topline finding is that we contribute, directly or indirectly, \$120,000,000.00 per year to the Solano economy and support

over 500 jobs locally. We would be happy to share more information in that regard when the opportunity presents itself. Thank you for your consideration
