**RESOLUTION OF THE SOLANO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE
COUNTY OF SOLANO IN ITS CAPACITY AS THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE VACAVILLE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT
TO ESTABLISH A 14-DAY WORK PERIOD**

Whereas, the Board of Supervisors on March 11, 2025, appointed itself the Board of Directors of the Vacaville Fire Protection District; and

Whereas, the Montezuma, Suisun, and Vacaville Fire Protection Districts (Districts) are working on a consolidation effort and the submission of an application to the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of Solano for reorganization into one district; and

Whereas, during the consolidation process, the Districts have been directed to continue to seek ways to align their operations, including providing consistency in shifts and staffing; and

Whereas, 29 U.S. Code §207(k) Fair Labor Standards Act allows for a fire district to adopt a work period between 7 and 28 days; and

Whereas, the Vacaville Fire Protection District desires to establish a work period of 14-days to provide consistency of shift operations between the Districts; and


Whereas, the Districts already follow a 14-day payroll cycle.

Resolved, the Solano County Board of Supervisors in its capacity as the Board of Directors of the Vacaville Fire Protection District hereby approves a 14-day work period be adopted.

Resolved, the Vacaville Fire Protection District will follow FLSA posting requirements prior to the implement of this new work period.
