FIFTH AMENDMENT TO SOLANO COUNTY STANDARD CONTRACT #2016-712

This FIFTH AMENDMENT TO SOLANO COUNTY STANDARD CONTRACT #2016-712 ("Fifth Amendment") is entered into as of July 1, 2019, between the County of Solano, a political subdivision of the State of California, ("County"), and Dixon Family Services on behalf of its Family Resource Center ("Contractor").

1. Recitals

- A. The parties entered into that certain Solano County Standard Contract known as contract #2016-712 on June 7, 2016 ("Agreement"), to provide family strengthening support services;
- B. The parties entered into a First Amendment to the Agreement on December 12, 2016 to adjust compensation for decreased services;
- C. The parties entered into a Second Amendment to the Agreement on May 5, 2017 to adjust for a Year 2 funding increase for incorporation of the Children's Trust Fund to provide additional basic needs support;
- D. The parties entered into a Third Amendment to the Agreement on July 1, 2017 to adjust for a Year 2 reduction of contract activities and funding;
- E. The parties entered into a Fourth Amendment the Agreement on July 1, 2018 to adjust for a Year 3 funding increase for incorporation of the Children's Trust Fund for additional basic needs support:
- F. County and Contractor now desire to amend the Agreement a fifth time to extend the term and increase the amount of the Agreement for Year 4 as set forth below.

2. Agreement

- A. Section 2 of the Agreement is deleted and replaced in its entirety with the following:
 - The Term of this Contract is July 1, 2016 June 30, 2020
- B. Section 3 of the Agreement is deleted and replaced in its entirety with the following: The maximum amount of this Contract is \$106,780 total:
 - Up to \$37,262 for Year 1 (7/1/2016 6/30/2017)
 - Up to \$20,700 for Year 2 (7/1/2017 6/30/2018)
 - Up to \$24,409 for Year 3 (7/1/2018 6/30/2019)
 - Up to \$24,409 for Year 4 (7/1/2019 6/30/2020)
- C. Exhibit A-1.4 for the period of 7/1/2019-6/30/2020 is attached to and incorporated into this Fifth Amendment.
- D. Exhibit B-2.4 for the period of 7/1/2019-6/30/2020 is attached to and incorporated into this Fifth Amendment.

3. Effectiveness of the Contract

Except as expressly set forth in this Fifth Amendment, the terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.
