## RESOLUTION OF THE SOLANO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RECOGNIZING THE FOOD BANK OF CONTRA COSTA AND SOLANO FOR 30 YEARS OF SERVICE TO SOLANO COUNTY

**WHEREAS**, for five decades, the Food Bank has partnered with local agencies, volunteers, donors, and community members to distribute millions of meals, expand access to CalFresh/SNAP, and advocate for stronger safety nets; and

**WHEREAS**, the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano proudly celebrates 30 years of serving Solano County, working tirelessly to provide food, hope, and dignity to neighbors in need while leading the fight to end hunger; and


**WHEREAS**, everyone needs nutritious food to reach their full potential, yet in 2023, 52,750 individuals – including more than 17,270 children-faced food insecurity in Solano County. To meet this need, the Food Bank served an average of 31,959 households each month throughout the County; and

**WHEREAS**, through its network of food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, and partner organizations, the Food Bank distributed nearly 1,302,312 pounds of food each month in 2024, ensuring the families, seniors, and individuals across Solano County could access the nourishment they need; and

**WHEREAS**, Solano County is proud to partner with the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano, a member of the Feeding America nationwide network, in raising awareness of hunger, educating the public about the role of food banks, and encouraging residents to join in the collective effort to end hunger.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Solano County Board of Supervisors does hereby recognizes the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano for 30 years of service to Solano County and commends the organization for three decades of dedication to building a hunger-free, healthier community.


