RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SOLANO COUNTY DESIGNATING KAISER PERMANENTE'S CRISIS STABILIZATION UNIT AS A WELFARE AND INSTITUTIONS CODE §§5150 et seg. INVOLUNTARY DETENTION FACILITY

WHEREAS, Welfare and Institutions Code §§5150 et seq. authorizes the County of Solano to designate facilities as evaluation and treatment facilities under the above-referenced code sections and professional persons to take or cause to be taken certain mentally disordered adults, children, and adolescents into custody; and

WHEREAS, Kaiser Permanente's crisis stabilization unit located in Fairfield, California, meets the requirements to be designated as an evaluation and treatment facility pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code §§5150 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, individuals can be placed in Kaiser Permanente's crisis stabilization unit under Welfare and Institutions Code §§5150 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Medical Director at Kaiser Permanente's crisis stabilization unit and its staff are appropriate mental health professionals to make determinations under §§5150 et seq.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Kaiser Permanente's crisis stabilization unit and its mental health staff professionals are designated by the County as specified in §§5150 et seq. of the Welfare and Institutions Code of the State of California, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That the Medical Director of the designated facility submit a list of such authorized professional persons on an annual basis to the Solano County Behavioral Health Director; and
- 2. That such individuals have completed a 5150 et seq. training course, approved by the Solano County Behavioral Health Director, every two (2) years or in accordance with current County Policy; and
- 3. That this designation to detain persons is applicable 24 hours per day and 7 days a week at Kaiser Permanente's crisis stabilization unit; and
- 4. That Kaiser Permanente's crisis stabilization unit shall retain responsibility for providing such care as is medically and clinically appropriate, consistent with its policies and health plan contracts; and
- 5. That the designated facility operations will be consistent with all relevant statutes, codes, and regulations; and
- 6. That this designation is contingent upon triennial (every three years) review and approval by the Solano County Behavioral Health Director.
