Director of Admin Services Lisa Donahue introduced the item provided an overview of the fingerprint identification program and the requested vehicle registration fee increases.

Identification Bureau Supervisor Aryn Watts provided an overview of the Cal-Id program.

Chair Mashburn opened and closed the public hearing with no comments from the public.

Chair Mashburn shared a story regarding how important the Cal-ID program is to the safety of the public.

On motion of Supervisor Vasquez, seconded by Supervisor Brown, the Board: 1) approved an increase of motor vehicle registration fees from \$1 to \$2 and commercial vehicle registration fees from \$2 to \$4 pursuant to California Vehicle Code §9250.19 as authorized by Assembly Bill 2393 (2014) to exclusively fund the fingerprint identification program; and 2) adopted Resolution No. 2025-66, imposing the fees, effective October 1, 2025, to be distributed to the California identification fund administered by the Sheriff's Office. ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC con't

There were no additional items from the public.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS AND REPORTS ON MEETINGS

Chair Mashburn invited members of the Board to make comments or reports on meetings. The following comments were received:

A) Supervisor Brown requested that this meeting of the Solano County Board of Supervisors be adjourned in memory of Adolofo Alcala Manuel. Supervisor Brown further commented on an upcoming item on the City of Vallejo City Council Agenda, to adopt a resolution approving funding for a contract with the Solano County Sheriff's Department for the provision of public safety officers, noting she would like to know when the Board of Supervisors will be discussing this item.

In response to Supervisor Brown's question, Assistant County Administrator Ian Goldberg stated once the City Council moves through their discussion, staff will work to bring the item back to the Board in open session. Mr. Goldberg further stated the County has not entered into a contract with the City of Vallejo at this time, they have simply had an initial discussion through the Sheriff's office. Mr. Goldberg further stated once an additional discussion with the City of Vallejo happens where they indicate if they are interested in pursing a contract staff will bring the item back to the Board.

Supervisor Brown asked if there will be discussions regarding monetary compensation regarding the amount of staff time that has been used should the City of Vallejo want to pursue a contract, noting the law expires in 2026.

B) Chair Mashburn stated he needs to clarify a few points for public and request the Board's approval for staff to bring forward an agenda item. Chair Mashburn further stated it was published in several newspapers that he had participated in a committee set up by Solano County's Assembly representative with regard to the concept of ship yard build in Collinsville. Chair Mashburn further stated he is not on a committee reviewing the project, nor has he participated in any of the meetings, noting in his current role it would not be appropriate. Chair Mashburn further stated he won't be participating in any meeting until this issue comes before the Board. Chair Mashburn requested staff provide a presentation on April 22, 2025, that covers specifically what is and is not allowed in the General Plan with regard to Collinsville and the properties in that area that are designated as potentially available for the maritime industry. Chair Mashburn further requested staff provide as part of that presentation anything that has been submitted related to the proposal/project to ensure the Board has more than rumor or conjecture as to what is going to occur in that site, and are then able to speak to their support or non support for a proposal of this type. Chair Mashburn further noted this will provide members of the public with information and the ability to provide their input as well. Chair Mashburn further stated for the public's information he wants to make two things clear, the first being that the current General Plan may allow for projects similar to what is being dicussed, and the second being that there is no other governmental agency that has the jurisdiction to approve a project in that particular region of the County.

There was consensus of the Board to bring this item back on April 22, 2025.
