WHEREAS, since our great Nation's birth, our beloved America has been blessed with an infinite chain of patriotic heroes who have served or are serving our Armed Forces with honor and distinction; and from the forests of New England, to the halls of Montezuma, seas of the Philippines, skies of Europe, jungles of Vietnam, and deserts and mountains of Iraq and Afghanistan, numerous generations of brave warriors have valiantly fought over air, sea, and land in some of the most horrific conditions in history; and

WHEREAS, on Veterans Day, our beautiful and historic County of Solano pauses to honor and pay tribute to ALL who have served or are serving in our military because each time our values have come under assault, they have responded with resolve, and their service, valor, and sacrifice have allowed our Republic to flourish, and our great Nation acknowledges our profound debt of gratitude to the patriots who have kept our Union whole; and

WHEREAS, Veterans Day originated as "Armistice Day" on November 11, 1919 on the first anniversary of the end of World War I on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month; then it became an annual observance in 1926, then a national holiday in 1938 when it officially became "Veterans Day" in 1954 – an inclusive day for our grateful Nation to pay appropriate homage to all veterans and service members; and

DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:

Supervisor Monica Brown requests that the Board approve \$250 from the District 2 Non-County Contribution fund to the Filipino Community of Solano County Inc, a 501(c) 3 nonprofit corporation. The Filipino Community of Solano County Inc. provides support, outreach, programs and other services to the County in support the Filipino community.

SUMMARY:

Guidelines for Grant Funding Requests: During the 2020/2021 Budget Hearings, the Board appropriated \$25,000, \$5,000 to each supervisorial district, to allow Board members to support community service programs. The Board directed County Counsel to provide guidelines on how to recommend funding for qualifying agencies or programs.

The guidelines are as follows:

- 1) Each supervisor must submit the proposed expenditure to the County Counsel and the Auditor/Controller for initial review.
- The Board must approve the expenditure by a majority vote.
- 3) The Board must determine that the expenditure is for a public purpose.
- 4) The Board may authorize an expenditure of public funds to a nonprofit organization so long as the County retains ultimate control over the exercise of judgment and discretion of the intended program.
- 5) To ensure accountability, all expenditures are subject to periodic audit by the Auditor/Controller; and
- a) If the recipient provides an activity, program or service ("activity"), it shall provide an activity report within 30 days of the activity that states the number of persons attending (if applicable) or participating activities carried out, feedback from participants (if applicable) and benefits of the activity. The recipient's failure to provide a report may result in its being considered ineligible for

future funding.

b) If the recipient is purchasing property or making improvements, it shall use the funds for only the specified purposes and allow representatives of the county to inspect and/or audit the purchase or the contractor's performance, the facility or the portion improved with the funds and/or the records pertaining to the expenditures. The recipient shall retain for inspection and audit purposes any and all books, receipts, documentation and other records of the expenditures for three (3) years from the date of receiving funds.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The cost of this item is \$250 and is included in the District 2 Non-County Contribution budget for FY 2021/22. The costs associated with preparing the agenda item are nominal and absorbed by the department's FY2021/22 Adopted budget.

ALTERNATIVES:

Supervisor Hannigan requests that the Board of Supervisors adopt a resolution recognizing November 2020 as Native American Heritage Month.

SUMMARY:

Native American Heritage Month has been established at the national and state levels with proclamations and celebrations to recognize the diverse cultures, traditions, histories, significant contributions and present day lives of Native Americans. Long before the Spanish and other Euro-Americans arrived in the area today known as Solano County, the area was home to indigenous people known as the Patwin, or Southern Wintun.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The costs associated with preparing the agenda item are nominal and absorbed by District 1 FY2020/21 Adopted Budget. The costs associated with preparation and purchase of the resolution materials are included in the Board's FY2020/21 Adopted Budget.

DISCUSSION:

Solano County is named for a Patwin leader, Sina or Sem Yeto, whom Spanish missionaries christened and assigned the Spanish name of "Solano." The earliest historic written records of the Patwin (which literally means "people" in the native tribal language) begin with the Spanish mission explorations and registers, and ethno-historic records show the Patwin inhabited the lower hills of the eastern North Coast Ranges to the Sacramento River, and from Princeton south to the San Pablo and Suisun bays, including the City of Vallejo.

Even though Solano County contains no reservations, the County of Solano enjoys a government-to-government relationship with the closest Patwin tribe, specifically the Yocha Dehe Wintun

Nation, whose people live in an area now known as the Capay Valley in adjacent Yolo County, which literally means "home by the spring water."

Yocha Dehe is recognized by the State's Native American Heritage Commission as the Most Likely Descendent of the Patwin people buried in Solano County. The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation works closely with local governments and agencies throughout the County to protect sacred burial sites from disturbance and desecration.

Yocha Dehe, including its sister Patwin Tribe, Kletsel Dehe Band of Wintun Indians, helped save a controversial waterfront park project in the City of Vallejo's Glen Cove, negotiating a landmark cultural easement that satisfied opponents, while protecting the burial sites and sacred resources contained there, and allowing the Patwin tribes to practice their traditional ceremonies.

Even though the Yocha Dehe people lived in grinding poverty for many decades after being settled on a remote rancheria without sufficient water resources and economic opportunities, the Tribe has a rich history of sharing the fruits of its success with others, having established a philanthropic fund in 2000 that has supported various non-profits and public interest causes within Solano County. In that same spirit, the Tribe renegotiated its gaming compact with the State of California in 2016, securing the right to redirect money that would otherwise go to the State's general fund to, among other recipients, local governments and people in need, including Solano County.

The Tribe has successfully partnered with Solano County to support several health and welfare programs designed to improve the lives of people in its ancestral territory, and the County greatly values its relationship with the Patwin tribe. Solano County honors the history of Yocha Dehe and its sister Patwin tribes, in tribute to all of the people of Patwin descent whose ancestors once resided in Solano County.

Honorable Members of the Board:

It is my pleasure to present the quarterly report for the first quarter of FY2020/21.

State of the Treasury

The \$1.4 billion Treasurer's pool is managed in accordance with the tenets of California Government Code §53600.5 to provide for the safety of principal, adequate liquidity for all anticipated cash flow requirements, and a consistent rate of return commensurate with the established risk profile.

The \$368.4 million currently held in cash and investments with six months or less left to maturity should provide adequate funding for all anticipated cash needs, while also affording the Treasury an opportunity to invest excess liquidity at higher rates.

The treasury pool is maintained with a duration designed to stabilize yields consistent with the risk profile established by the Treasurer. The treasury pool is also diversified from a credit risk perspective by maintaining a mix of investments that includes 11.7% in cash and cash equivalents, 17.9% in US Treasuries, 47.9% in Government Sponsored Enterprises, 7.3% in US Corporations and 3.3% in Municipals; with the balance of 11.9% held in a variety of assets including mutual funds, commercial paper, and other holdings allowable under \$53600.5.

Current Market Conditions Impacting the Treasury Pool

Treasury managers monitor information provided by the Federal Reserve; its actions and information impact the interest rates at the short end of the curve where nearly all the treasury investments are made.

In the September 16, 2020 Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) statement, the committee kept fund rates at .25 upper bound and .00 lower bound.

The September 2, 2020 Beige Book report of the 12 federal districts report economic activity and employment has improved in the quarter. However, both remain well below where they were prior to COVID. Manufacturing and consumer spending continued to increase but the pace of growth slowed. Residential construction was strong, and real estate sales were notably higher with prices continuing to rise in conjunction with demand, and a shortage of inventory. The banking sector reported overall loan demand increased slightly. On the other hand, commercial construction was down widely, and commercial real estate remained in contraction. The districts also reported continuing uncertainty and volatility related to the pandemic. The committee expects to maintain an accommodative stance until its stated goals have been achieved. The committees stated goals are inflation moderately over 2% for some time, and maximum employment.

Expectations going forward

Given the FOMC statement and data provided in the Beige Book Report, treasury managers expect interest rates on the short end of the interest rate curve to remain close to zero for the next quarter. As investments in the pool mature and are reinvested, the yield on newly invested funds will be substantially lower, and the pool earnings will be less than in previous quarters.

Credit quality of corporate securities will continue to be monitored more closely during this crisis, and investments will continue to be diversified to mitigate risk. Given the shape of the yield curve, liquidity will be increased in the coming quarter.

Should the treasury experience unusual demands on cash, the liquidity position will be adjusted accordingly.

Investments:

The investment portfolio has been reviewed by the Treasurer-Tax Collector-County Clerk on September 30, 2020 and found to be in compliance with the Investment Policy.

Reporting and Distribution:

In accordance with Government code section 53607, a monthly report is submitted to the Clerk of the Board electronically.

In accordance with the Government Code section 53646 this non-mandated quarterly report is submitted to provide full disclosure to the Board and public.

This report is also made available to the Superintendent of Schools, the business managers of each district, many pool participants and the public at large via the Internet.

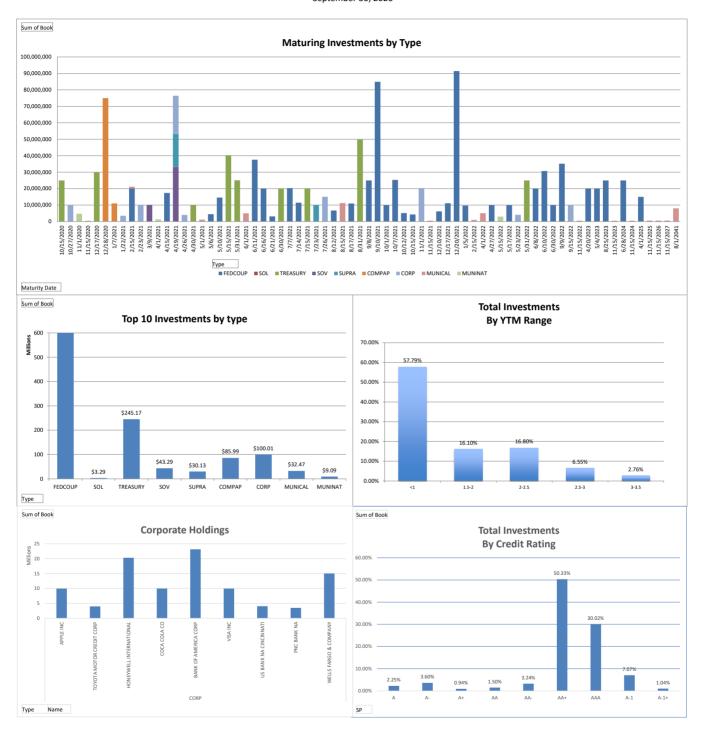

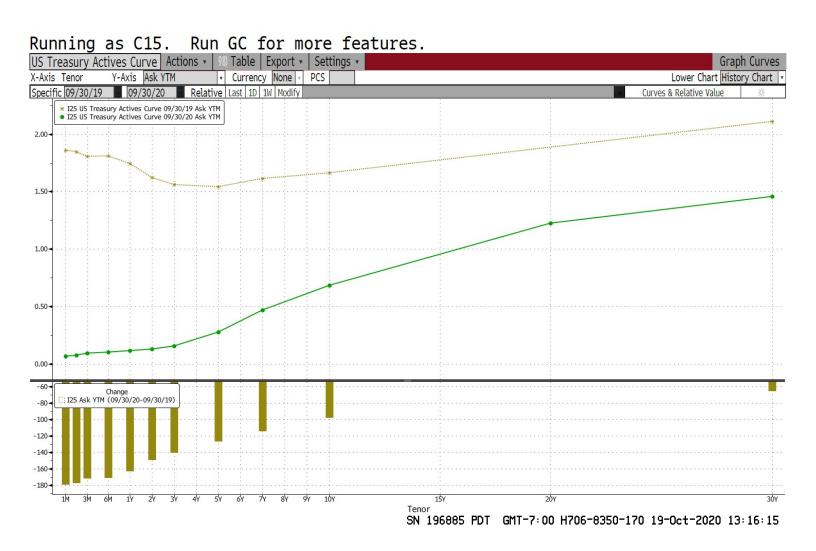

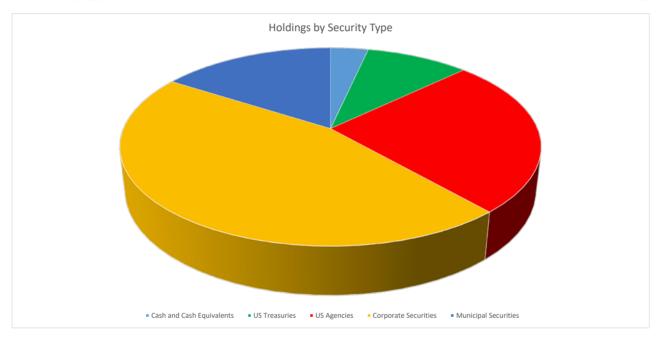

DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Health and Social Services (H&SS) recommends the Board adopt a resolution recognizing the month of November 2020 as National Adoption Month in Solano County.

SUMMARY:

November is "National Adoption Month" and Solano County has a long tradition of formally recognizing and appreciating the adoptive families who provide permanency to children in need, and the social workers who make and support these life-long connections. The Solano County Adoption Month declaration helps to increase awareness about adoption in the Solano community, and inspire all towards excellence in achieving permanency for youth. The national theme for 2020 is "Engage Youth: Listen and Learn."

Teenagers are less likely to be adopted, often because of their age, and are much more likely to age out of foster care without strong or stable family support. Securing lifelong connections for teens in foster care, both legally and emotionally, is a critical component in determining their future achievements, health, and well-being. Adoption is one way that children who are unable to return to their biological families can find this permanency.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The costs associated with preparing the agenda item are nominal and absorbed by the Department's FY2020/21 Adopted Budget. The costs associated with preparation and purchase of the resolution materials are included in the Board's FY2020/21 Adopted Budget.

DISCUSSION:

National Adoption Month has been promoted and celebrated every November for over two decades in communities across the country. Many national, State, and local agencies as well as foster, kinship care, and adoptive family groups help educate their communities through programs, events, and activities that aim to raise awareness about the thousands of children and youth currently in foster care who are waiting for their own permanent, loving families.

In Solano County, there are 351 children currently in out of home foster care placement, of which 141 children have been referred for adoption services. Solano County Child Welfare Services (CWS) is pleased to report that 45 children have been adopted during this program year, and this number is anticipated to increase in future years as permanency efforts are nurtured and strengthened. CWS believes that every child and teenager in America, including those in Solano County, deserves a permanent loving family and a home in which they can develop to their fullest potential.

Solano County CWS has expanded its permanency process by the creation of adoptive profiles and creative search engagements for adoptive families for youth, often teenagers, who were previously uninterested in pursuing adoption but now wish to find permanency. This process came out of social workers' practice of engaging youth, listening and learning. While teens are often unable to consider permanency immediately after learning they cannot reunify with their parents, their perspective can change and evolve. Maintaining a dialogue with youth about their permanency needs over time allows for this evolution and keeps permanency options open.

Child Welfare Services continuously recruits for adoptive families in order to meet the need for permanent homes and expedite placement for children into permanent homes. Formally recognizing November as National Adoption Month in Solano County provides an opportunity to acknowledge adoptive families and all of the dedicated professionals in Solano County who work diligently to help children and youth find permanent, stable and loving homes.

ALTERNATIVES:

The Board may choose not to adopt the resolution. This is not recommended because National Adoption Month provides an opportunity to celebrate with adoptive parents who open their homes and hearts to children in need, and to recognize County staff and other professionals who assist children in finding permanent homes.

DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Health and Social Services (H&SS) recommends that the Board of Supervisors accept a one-time grant for up to \$308,265 from Partnership HealthPlan of California to support implementation and execution of virtual video visits in Family Health Services from December 31, 2020 through March 31, 2021, approve the related Appropriation Transfer Request to recognize the unanticipated grant revenue (4/5 vote required), and authorize the County Administrator to execute the grant agreement with Partnership HealthPlan of California.

SUMMARY:

Solano County Health and Social Services, Family Health Services (FHS) applied for the Primary Care Provider (PCP) Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) Virtual Video Care Grant to receive up to \$308,265 from Partnership HealthPlan of California (PHC) to implement and execute video telehealth services. This grant is expected to increase the number of video healthcare appointments provided by FHS, which will allow for more comprehensive patient care. Video healthcare visits also provide an opportunity to increase patient visits, particularly for patients who choose to minimize public contact or who have transportation or other constraints that limit their ability to visit their provider in person.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The receipt of the one-time grant incentive payment is contingent upon achieving certain milestones which require at least twenty percent (20%) of virtual care visits are done by video over a consecutive 90-day period. The measurement period can start any time after April 1, 2020. Increases in video visitation may also

increase total clinic visits, helping to maximize funding for patients assigned to FHS.

The one-time grant incentive payment reduces the use of 1991 Public Health Realignment in FHS while maintaining the overall FY2020/21 Adopted Budget at the same level with no impact on County General Fund.

The cost associated with preparing the agenda item is nominal and absorbed by the Department's FY2020/21 Adopted Budget.

DISCUSSION:

PHC is a non-profit, community-based healthcare organization that contracts with the State to administer Medi-Cal benefits through local care providers, including H&SS FHS, to ensure Medi-Cal recipients have access to high-quality, comprehensive, cost-effective healthcare.

The PCP QIP Virtual Video Care Grant supports PHC's goal to promote video care visits, and it will build upon existing services in the FHS clinics while providing patients another option to receive care.

ALTERNATIVES:

The Board could choose not to accept these grant funds. This alternative is not recommended as the grant provides funding for implementation and execution of crucial video telehealth services. Limiting access to telehealth services can result in poor health outcomes and patients seeking emergency services for illness that could have been prevented with a primary care visit.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

PCP QIP VIRTUAL VIDEO CARE GRANT AGREEMENT

This Primary Care Provider Quality Improvement Program ("PCP QIP") Virtual Video Care Grant Services Agreement ("Agreement") is effective as of December 31, 2020 ("Effective Date") by and between **PARTNERSHIP HEALTHPLAN OF CALIFORNIA**, a public entity contracted with the Department of Health Care Services ("DHCS") hereafter referred to as ("PHC"), and **SOLANO COUNTY HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES** hereafter referred to as ("Grantee" or "Grantor"), both also referred hereafter as ("Party" and "Parties"). The term of this Agreement shall run from December 31, 2020 through March 31, 2021. As there is no assurance or guarantee of funding beyond the period specified above, a new agreement would need to be executed between the aforementioned Parties to extend incentive payment.

BACKGROUND

PHC is a non-profit community-based health care organization that contracts with the State to administer Medi-Cal benefits through local care providers to ensure Medi-Cal recipients have access to high-quality comprehensive cost-effective health care. PHC provides quality health care to over 540,000 Medi-Cal recipients ("Members"). Beginning in Solano County in 1994, PHC now provides services to 14 Northern California counties: Del Norte, Humboldt, Lake, Lassen, Marin, Mendocino, Modoc, Napa, Shasta, Siskiyou, Solano, Sonoma, Trinity and Yolo.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, PHC strongly supports the goal of better access to virtual care and has a grant incentive for contracted Primary Care Provider Grantees to promote video visits in each of PHC's 14 counties.

WHEREAS, this Agreement identifies each party's responsibilities and obligations for the allocation of the grant funds to support a project that will improve virtual care video visits for Medi-Cal members enrolled with PHC.

WHEREAS, PHC desires to provide a one-time incentive payment to the Grantee to support the implementation and execution of virtual video visits upon successful completion of the milestone and outcome mentioned in **Exhibit A**.

WHEREAS, the Grantee is able to perform the responsibilities and adhere to the terms and conditions as set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants hereinafter stated, it is agreed by and between the Parties hereto as follows:

I. GRANTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. Provide optimal health care services to the communities they serve, including PHC Members, in accordance with state and federal laws, guidelines, standards, and requirements.
- B. Serve as a telehealth location to perform and/or facilitate access to medical services for PHC

members.

- C. Facilitate and utilize telecommunications technology, equipment, systems and broadband that meets state and federal guidelines and requirements to improve virtual care.
- D. Grantee agrees that the services provided pursuant to this grant are provided for the benefit of PHC members and all target population members within the Providers practice panel.
- E. Grantee agrees to work with PHC staff in order to facilitate the evaluation of the effectiveness of this program and to provide information on the progress of the project.
- F. Grantee agrees to designate a primary staff member as the point of contact for the purposes of the administration of this grant.
- G. Submit telehealth data to PHC as required in Section III, Payment.
- H. Provider agrees funds will not be used to reimburse for services currently reimbursable under Medi-Cal but must be used to improve the delivery system for Medi-Cal managed care enrollees.

II. PHC RESPONSIBILITIES

- **A.** Provide a one-time payment by means of a grant to the "Grantee" for the successful completion of the milestone specified in **Exhibit A**, for each participating site location in **Exhibit B**
- B. Provide a one-time grant payment according to the amount based on the achievement of the milestone for each participating site listed in **Exhibit B**. In no event shall payments exceed the total grant award as indicated in **Exhibit B** for the term of this Agreement. If the terms and conditions set forth in **Exhibits A & B** are not met, including timely reporting, PHC reserves the right to withhold payment and the right to move to terminate this Agreement.
- C. If a site location does not meet the milestone specified in **Exhibit A**, the parent organization will not be eligible to receive grant payment for that specific site location.

III. PAYMENT

A one-time PCP QIP Virtual Grant Program incentive payment will be provided to the participating parent organization for each site location and is subject to successful completion of the milestone referenced in **Exhibit A**, and will be issued as follows:

- A. Funding will be issued as per the terms of this agreement listed in **Exhibits A & B**.
- B. Will be based on the successful achievement of the milestone at the participating site level.
- C. Telehealth data must be received from the Health Centers parent organization to PHC's dedicated Grants mailbox (Grants@partnershiphp.org) upon the successful completion of the milestone referenced in **Exhibit A**.
- D. Telehealth data must be received timely; submitted on the required telehealth data tracking sheet (or equivalent); must be accurate and complete; and must be submitted through an approved secure method.

IV. REPORTING

- A. Telehealth data reported to PHC must demonstrate 20% of all telehealth visits are administered via video for a consecutive 90-day period.
- B. Telehealth data must be submitted using the telehealth data tracking sheets (or equivalent) provided by PHC to the parent organization (see Exhibit C).

- C. Data tracking sheets are required to be submitted to PHC's dedicated Grants mailbox (Grants@partnershiphp.org) upon the successful completion of the milestone referenced in **Exhibit A**.
- D. Data tracking sheets must include the following key components for payment consideration for eligible encounters:
 - Reporting Period
 - Parent Organization Name
 - Site Name
 - PHC Provider #
 - County

- Patient Name
- Patient CIN #
- Date of Service (DOS)
- Type of Visit (Modality)
- Patient Type

V. TERM/CANCELLATION

- A. <u>Term.</u> The initial term of this Agreement shall run from December 31, 2020 through March 31, 2021.
- B. <u>Cancellation/Termination</u>. This Agreement may be cancelled by either Party with thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other Party, with or without cause. The Parties to this Agreement agree that should the Provider notify PHC of an intent to terminate the Provider Agreement that governs the Provider's provision of health care services to PHC members, all unpaid funds will be forfeited.
- C. <u>Provider in Good Standing</u>. Providers in good standing are those currently contracted with PHC for the delivery of services, not currently in contract negotiations, not pursuing litigation or arbitration against PHC at the time of program application or at the time additional funds may be payable, and has demonstrated the intent, in PHC's sole determination, to continue to work together on addressing community and member issues. Additionally, at the direction of the Chief Executive Officer or designee, PHC may determine that a Provider is not in good standing based on relevant quality, payment or other business concerns.

VI. OTHER PROVISIONS

- A. <u>Disputes</u>. In the event that any dispute, claim, or controversy of any kind or nature relating to this Agreement arises between the parties, the Parties agree to meet and make a good faith effort to resolve the dispute. Nothing herein is intended to prevent either party from seeking any other remedy available at law including seeking redress in a court of competent jurisdiction. This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- B. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement, with its attachments, constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties governing the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement replaces any prior written or oral communications or agreements between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement cannot be assigned or delegated to another entity by either Party.
- C. Existing Contract. This Agreement does not supersede nor replace the existing Hospital, Health Center, or Contracted Site Provider Contract(s) between PHC and the Hospital, Health Center, or Contracted Site. Where this Agreement conflicts with the Provider Contract between the Parties, the Provider Contract shall prevail.

- D. <u>Amendment</u>. Except as may otherwise be specified in this Agreement and any applicable attachments, the Agreement (including its attachments) may be amended only by both Parties agreeing to the amendment in writing, executed by a duly authorized person of each Party.
- E. <u>Waiver/Estoppel</u>. Nothing in this Agreement is considered to be waived by any Party, unless the Party claiming the waiver receives the waiver in writing. No breach of the Agreement is considered to be waived unless the non-breaching party waives it in writing. A waiver of one provision does not constitute a waiver of any other. A failure of either Party to enforce at any time any of the provisions of this Agreement, or to exercise any option which is herein provided in this Agreement, will in no way be construed to be a waiver of such provision of this Agreement.
- F. Non-Discrimination. During the performance of this Agreement, Health Center and its subcontractors shall not unlawfully discriminate or harass against any employee or applicant for employment because of sex, race, color, ancestry, religious creed, national origin, physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), mental disability, medical condition (cancer), age (over 40) marital status and use of family care leave and any other characteristics covered under state and federal law. Health Center and subcontractors shall ensure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free of such discrimination and harassment.
- G. <u>Compliance with Law.</u> PHC is a public agency subject to the laws of the California Public Records Act ("CPRA"). Health Center agrees to comply with all State and local licensing standards, all applicable accrediting standards, and any other standards or criteria established by the State, or locally, to assure quality of service. Health Center agrees to comply with all applicable State and Federal laws and regulations during the term of this Agreement.
- H. <u>Audit</u>. PHC reserves the right to audit data submissions prior to payment. Upon request, Health Center agrees to provide copies of the Telehealth consultation documentation.
- I. Force Majeure. Each party will take commercially reasonable steps to prevent and recover from disruptive events that are beyond its control and represents that it has backup systems in place in case of emergencies or natural disasters. If either party shall be, wholly or in part, unable to perform any or part of its duties or functions under this Agreement because an act of war, riot, terrorist action, weather-related disaster, earthquake, governmental action, unavailability or breakdown of equipment, or other industrial disturbance which is beyond the reasonable control of the party obligated to perform and which by the exercise of reasonable diligence such party is unable to prevent (each a "Force Majeure Event"), then, and only upon giving the other party notice by telephone, facsimile or in writing within a reasonable time and in reasonably full detail of the Force Majeure Event, such party's duties or functions shall be suspended during such inability; provided, however, that in the event that a Force Majeure Event delays such party's performance for more than thirty (30) days following the date on which notice was given to the other party of the Force Majeure Event, the other party may terminate this Agreement. Neither party shall be liable to the other for any damages caused or occasioned by a Force Majeure Event. Government actions resulting from matters that are subject to the control of the party shall not be deemed Force Majeure Events.
- J. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed by electronic signatures or in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which, together, shall constitute one agreement.

- K. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the remaining portions of the Agreement shall be construed as if not containing such provision, and all other rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced accordingly.
- L. <u>Survival of Terms</u>. Any provisions of this Agreement, or any attachments, and exhibits, which by their nature, extend beyond the expiration, or termination of this Agreement, and those provisions that are expressly stated to survive termination, shall survive the termination of this Agreement, and shall remain in effect until all such obligations are satisfied.

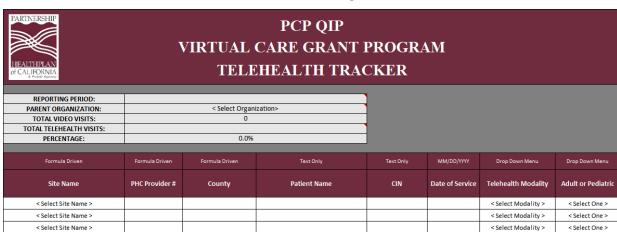
