# Solano County Library Strategic Directions: Conversation, Connection, Community

Between January and July 2011, the Library undertook the development of a new strategic plan. Building on discussions with the community and Library staff, Library Administration and a planning committee developed a series of strategic directions that set service priorities for the coming years. The strategic directions for Solano County Library are:

- Build partnerships to make a difference in people's lives.
- Inspire and educate by sharing our passions.
- Lead through change and learning.
- Celebrate our diverse and distinctive environment.

#### **Strategic Reality Check Process**

In developing this plan, the Library followed a four-step process developed by Joan Frye-Williams and George Needham. These library consultants and strategists presented the methodology to the Library supervisors and managers in January 2011. The process that the Library followed included:


**Service assessment:** Analyzing the Library's service related data, including current usage statistics, demographic information of the entire County, other assessments and strategic plans from other institutions and organizations.

Community check-in: Hosting community meetings, to ask specific questions to solicit ideas of what makes a vibrant and healthy community. The feedback from these meetings was analyzed and formed the focus for discussion at subsequent staff meetings.

**Staff check-in:** Holding staff meetings to discuss the professional techniques and resources that the Library possesses to enable us to satisfy the vision expressed by the community.

**Realign service:** Using the information from the first three steps to determine broad strategic directions for the Library and to realign service to match the directions. This final step becomes a continuous, regular assessment, ensuring that Library service stays relevant to our community.







#### **Analysis of Community and Staff Feedback**

The planning committee analyzed the responses expressed in the Community meeting and presented those results to staff members. Discussions with staff focusing on techniques, resources, and principles helped us determine four general strategic directions that address the community's expressed desires. These strategic directions are described briefly below.



Solano County Library builds partnerships to make a difference in people's lives.

The participants in the community meeting clearly indicated that they supported the values implied in the adage "It Takes a Village": They wanted to deepen the connection between and among individuals and organizations that serve the public in order to enhance community life. These participants talked about seeing the need for collaboration and resource sharing in order to improve the quality of life for all residents. The participants felt strongly that County residents would respond positively to the chance to give back to the community through meaningful volunteer activities.

To this end, the Library will increase efforts to reach out to the community and respond to their feedback about relevant services. We will collaborate with other institutions that support our vision, offering an opportunity for mutual enhancement of our contributions to life in Solano County. The Library will effectively communicate information about our services to the community to ensure that residents are aware of and take full advantage of what we offer.

Participants in the community meeting were quite clear on the importance of education and personal growth. Their comments focused on the value of bettering oneself through a variety of learning opportunities and with the help of many public organizations, a value enthusiastically endorsed by the Library.

The Library will offer services that strengthen educational and personal growth experiences for all residents. The Library will demonstrate our support for the residents by responding to their interests in personal growth and continuing to provide varied enrichment experiences that help them attain it.

### Solano County Library celebrates our diverse and distinctive environment.

Community members expressed their appreciation of and their desire to preserve the unique environment and rural open spaces of Solano County. They are fully appreciative of the ethnic diversity of the people who live here and the richness that brings to the County's culture. They also value the mix of rural-urban neighborhoods and expressed an interest in using those features as an economic engine to attract and grow small businesses. Local government, businesses, and service organizations have indicated through programs and investments that cultural diversity and an open environment are part of the locale's attraction to new residents and businesses.
