

#### Change to boundary map of proposed Solano Subbasin GSA JPA Page 19




### **SGMA Overview**





### **SGMA Overview**

- Effective January 1, 2015
- Requires forming groundwater sustainability agencies (GSAs) by June 30, 2017
- Defines GSAs; local public agency with water supply, water management or land use responsibilities
- Requires GSAs to establish plans in medium and high priority basins by 2020 or 2022
- Creates State "backstop"




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# **GSA Formation - Multi-Year Process**

- Ad-hoc working group; staff
  from GSA-eligible agencies &
  public ag representatives; 30+
  meetings since 2015
- 7 public workshops, attended by 300+ participants
- 6000+ postcards to landowners in the subbasin & local newspaper advertising workshop notices
- Resulted in development of guiding principles, and JPA agreement



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
### **GSA Formation – Solano Subbasin**



### Solano Subbasin GSA - JPA

#### Governance: 11-member GSA Board, three representative groups

Municipal (3) – Cities of Dixon and Rio Vista, and Cal Water (MOU with GSA)

District (4) – Maine Prairie, RD 2068, Solano and Dixon RCDs

<u>Unincorporated Areas (4)</u> – Solano County Sup. Dist. 4 & 5 and two public seats: 1 public seat – Ag. Advisory nominee, approval by County Board of Supervisors 1 public seat – Farm Bureau nominee, approval by the GSA board

Voting: 1 vote / Director (majority voting for routine items)

Supermajority – 2/3 of GSA Board + 1 vote from each governance group for key actions (fees, budget, pumping restrictions, GSP approval, contracts over \$25,000, and changes in membership, and changes to the JPA)

GSA signatories can renegotiate JPA at a later date to further clarify commitment of public agency resources or change voting structure at a later date



## Solano Subbasin GSA – Funding

#### **Initial One-time Funding Contribution:**

\$6,000 contribution for each member seat, except the Farm Bureau nominated member seat (approval by the GSA Board)

- County contribution: \$18,000 (two Board seats and Ag Advisory nominated seat)

#### **Continued Funding for GSP Development and SGMA Compliance:**

Funded through assessments, fees, and charges

- Equitably; considers past costs by landowners to develop groundwater information

Alternate funding sources (State and Federal loans and grants) Costs for special projects borne by special management area beneficiaries

#### Intent of the JPA

Groundwater extractors to fund GSA, including GSP development and implementation GSA can utilize other funding mechanisms (grants and loans)



### Resolution

- Authorizes the Chair to execute the JPA establishing the proposed Solano Subbasin GSA
- Designates the 2 primary directors and requires selection of one alternate director from the Board of Supervisors
- Authorizes designated Board members to take all action necessary to carry out requirements of the JPA and represent the interests of Solano County




