



Proposition 47 Grant Program

Presented to Solano County Board of Supervisors

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Proposition 47 – Voter approved in 2014

- Reduced classification of most "non-serious, nonviolent property and drug crimes" from felony to misdemeanor
- Allowed previously convicted individuals to be resentenced or have felony designated as a misdemeanor
- Resulted in over \$68 million in State savings in FY16-17, now directed via grants toward prevention and services which can be:
 - Mental health services
 - Substance abuse services
 - Diversion services

Cross-Departmental County Collaboration

- Health and Social Services lead agency
- Developing Memorandums of Understanding with key County partners:
 - o Sheriff
 - o Probation

Solano County's Project Proposal

Over 100 stakeholders and Solano's Local Advisory Council recommended an emphasis on increasing access to substance abuse treatment.

\$6 million award to Solano County over 3 years with \$2,400,00 budgeted in year one. Program includes:

- Addition of detox/residential treatment beds (a minimum of 10 new beds)
- 2. Support through sober living (three locations with one dedicated to youth 18-25), and transitional housing (two locations, one for men and one for women)
- 3. Case management throughout the continuum of substance abuse treatment
- 4. Legal advocacy

- Mentally III Offender Crime Reduction Grant
- In-custody case management programs
- Whole Person Care Project
- Collaborative Courts
- Drug Medi-Cal expansion
- Homeless outreach
- Substance Abuse Prevention/Treatment

Program Goals and Outcome Objectives

Goal 1 – Strengthen System of Care

40% reduction in wait time to detox/residential treatment

Goal 2 – Reduce Recidivism

• 50% reduction in re-arrest rate

Goal 3 - Increase Income and Housing Stability

- 75% of program participants will have a stable income
- 50% of homeless will have some form of stable housing
- 90% of those eligible for SSI/SSA will apply or appeal denial

Goal 4 – Increase Positive Social Support

Increase prosocial leisure activities by 20%
