Ms. Lange provided an overview of AB 1250 (Jones-Sawyer) Counties and cities: contracts for personal services.

In response to questions from Supervisor Brown, Ms. Lange provided information on the legislation's history and purpose for being introduced.

Supervisor Brown commented on the taking away of union jobs and advised that she would be voting not to oppose the legislation.

County Counsel Dennis Bunting commented on the legislation's exemption of cities and noted that the legislation would create contracting challenges and the County's ability to respond quickly and effectively to situations.

In response to questions from Chair Vasquez, Mr. Bunting provided information on how the legislation might apply to emergency situations.

County Administrator Birgitta Corsello provided information on the Board Legislative Committee's discussions about the bill and then on state law and guidelines that applied to how counties and cities can provide services.

Supervisor Spering commented on protection of private sector jobs and small businesses.

Supervisor Thomson commented on state contributions for state mandated services mentioned in the legislation.

Ms. Corsello provided information on state mandates and noted the State's takeaway of reimbursements for past mandates.

Supervisor Thomson commented on the legislation's exemption for cities.

Mr. Bunting noted that the issue was that there was no rational basis for the exemption and commented on the difficulty of trying to evaluate the indirect costs of the legislation.

In response to a question from Supervisor Thomson, Mr. Bunting provided information on the what the County Counsel's Association feedback was on the legislation.

Supervisor Thomson advised that he was not supportive of an opposition position and would be supportive of taking a watch position to see whether there would be modifications made to the bill.

In response to a comment from Supervisor Hannigan, Ms. Lange provided information on amendments that had taken place to the legislation, noting that none had been offered for counties.

Supervisor Brown commented on amendments to the legislation.

Ms. Lange noted that amendments can happen quickly.

Supervisor Brown requested that staff provide updated information to the Board members.

Chair Vasquez noted that the information in the Board agenda packet contained the same information that the Legislative Committee reviewed.

Supervisor Hannigan commented in opposition to the legislation, noting that it would extend the amount of time it takes to get contracts in place, cost more money and limit the amount of services that can be provided.

Chair Vasquez invited members of the public to address the Board on this matter and the following comments were received:

A) George Guynn, Jr., Suisun City commented in opposition to AB 1250.

On motion of Supervisor Hannigan, seconded by Supervisor Spering, the Board approved an oppose position on AB 1250 (Jones-Sawyer) Counties and cities: contracts for personal services. Supervisors Brown and Thomson voted no. So ordered by 3-2 vote.

Ms. Lange provided an overview of the status of the state budget and issues of concern to the County.

In response to comments from Chair Vasquez, Ms. Lange provided information on recent state agency biologic opinions being released about the State's twin tunnel impact on the Delta Smelt.

Supervisor Thomson commented on building trust and the positive benefits of the work being done.

Chair Vasquez commented on efforts by the agency and community in the past to protect Travis AFB and create jobs in the community. He then thanked Mr. Quinn and Ms. Person for their work.

Director of Resource Management Bill Emlen introduced the item.

Senior Planner Karen Avery provided the Board with an overview of the proposal.

On motion of Supervisor Spering, seconded by Supervisor Brown, the Board approved reading the proposed ordinance amending Chapter 28 of the Solano County Code, amending Zoning Map 11-N to rezone the Rockville Trails Preserve Property from the Rural Residential (RR-2.5) and Policy Plan Overlay (PP-02-01) districts to the Exclusive Agricultural (A-20) and Policy Plan Overlay (PP-15-01) districts by title only and waived further reading by a majority vote. So ordered by 4-0 vote.

Chair Vasquez opened public hearing.

Executive Director of the Solano Land Trust Nicole Braddock provided an overview of the Solano Land Trust's vision for the property.

Solano Land Trust Project Manager Sue Wickham provided an overview of the project goals.

In response to a question from Supervisor Brown, Ms. Braddock noted that a school bus turnaround was included in the project plan. She then provided information on a proposed low-mobility trail included in the plan.

Chair Vasquez invited members of the public to address the Board on this matter and the following comments were received:

A) Larry Newhall, Fairfield, commented on concerns with the proposed parking lot location and requested that trails be kept a minimum of 500 feet from residential areas along the bottom area of the project.

Ms. Braddock noted that the proposed lower parking lot could be removed from the plan. She then noted that moving the trails a distance of 500 feet had not been studied but advised that she was willing to look at this with Mr. Newhall before trails were built.

Supervisor Spering commented on the distance of the trails and asked if the plan could be changed to include discussion on trails before they were built.

Mr. Emlen advised that staff could change the language to state 150 feet or more.

Ms. Braddock provided information on the current proposed trail buffer zone.

Mr. Newhall noted that he was looking for a buffer to ensure privacy in the area near his residence.

In response to comments from Supervisor Spering, County Administrator Birgitta Corsello commented on the project in regards to the proposed trails and parking lot locations.

Ms. Braddock noted that the Policy Plan Overlay (PPO) would allow for future trail creation within the boundaries of the park. She advised that a 150 foot buffer for the trails could be added to the plan.

Ms. Avery noted that County staff would not be involved in trail measurement or movement.

Supervisor Brown commented in support of changing the language to indicate a buffer zone of 150 feet or more for the trails.

Mr. Emlen advised that the language could be changed to include the 150 foot buffer and that staff would consult with the Land Trust and neighbors concerning creation of trails when looking at the administrative process of the project.

Ms. Braddock noted that she was in support of the amended language.

Supervisor Spering commented on future use and the importance of preserving privacy.

B) Linda Seifert, Fairfield, commented on the project's history and in support of the proposal.

Supervisor Spering commented on his prior request of staff at the FY2017/18 Budget Hearing to look at SB 1 funding for access to parks.

Supervisor Brown commented on Rockville Hill Park and in support of the proposal.

Chair Vasquez closed the public hearing.
