FIRST AMENDMENT TO SOLANO COUNTY STANDARD CONTRACT #2016-501

This FIRST AMENDMENT TO SOLANO COUNTY STANDARD CONTRACT # 2016-501 ("First Amendment") entered into as of September 1, 2017, between the County of Solano, a political subdivision of the State of California, for the benefit of First 5 Solano Children and Families Commission ("Commission"), and Solano County Office of Education ("Contractor").

WHEREAS, the parties entered into that certain Solano County Standard Contract known as contract number 2016-501, dated June 7, 2016 ("Agreement"), to provide Early Care and Education Services as described in Exhibit A to that Agreement ("program services"); and

WHEREAS, the Commission has additional funding of \$28,000 to increase the budget to allow for additional program services; and

WHEREAS, Contractor desires to provide additional program services; and

WHEREAS, Commission and Contractor desire to amend the Agreement as set forth below.

NOW THEREFORE, Commission and Contractor mutually agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

A. Section 3 of the Agreement is deleted and replaced in its entirety with the following:

The maximum amount of this Contract is: Up to\$542,061 for the term of the contract:

- Up to \$257,518 for Year 1 (07/01/2016 06/30/2017)
- Up to \$284,543 for Year 2 (07/01/2017-06/30/2018).
- B. Pages 6 to 9 of Exhibit A (Contractor Scope of Work) for FY2017/18 of the Agreement are deleted in their entirety and replaced with Exhibit A-1, which is attached to and incorporated into this First Amendment.
- C. Exhibit B-1 (Contractor Budget) for FY2017/18 of the Agreement is deleted in its entirety and replaced with Exhibit B-1.1, which is attached to and incorporated into this First Amendment.
- D. Except as expressly set forth in this First Amendment, the terms and conditions of the Original Agreement shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.
