Interim Urgency Ordinance Timeline

December 6, 2016, Board of Supervisor's:

- Approved a 45-day Interim Urgency Ordinance:
 - prohibiting commercial cultivation of medicinal and non-medicinal cannabis;
 - the commercial delivery, distribution, transportation, manufacturing, retail operations, and testing facilities for medicinal and non-medicinal cannabis; and
 - the outdoor cultivation of personal medicinal and nonmedicinal cannabis within unincorporated Solano County.
- Established a Board committee of 2 to guide cannabis related subjects and data gathering, appointed Supervisors Hannigan and Vasquez.

January 10, 2017, Board of Supervisor's:

Approved extension for 10 months 15-days of Interim Ordinance to December 6, 2017.



Interim Urgency Ordinance Final Extension

Staff Recommendation:

Approve request of a final one-year extension of the Urgency Ordinance to December 6, 2018.

Justification for extension:

November 14, 2017

- State regulatory process not determined and still evolving.
- The Bureau of Cannabis Control, Department of Public Health and Department of Food and Agriculture have not released regulations addressing medicinal and adult-use commercial cannabis regulations.
- Cannabis Ad-hoc Committee prioritized establishing regulations for personal and caregiver cannabis cultivation. Board took final action on an ordinance addressing personal and caregiver cultivation on October 24, 2017.
- Provision's pertaining to personal and caregiver cultivation are not included in this Interim Ordinance extension request.

State License Types: Cultivation

Type 1: Specialty Outdoor	0- 5,000 sq. ft. or up to 50 mature plants
Type 1A: Specialty Indoor	501-5,000 sq. ft.
Type 1B: Specialty Mixed-Light	2,501 – 5,000 sq. ft.
Type 1C: Specialty Cottage	0-2,500 sq. ft. mixed light; 0-25 mature
	plants outdoor; 0-500 sq. ft. indoor
Type 2: Small Outdoor	5,001-10,000 sq. ft.
Type 2A: Small Indoor	5,001-10,000 sq. ft.
Type 2B: Small Mixed Light	5,0001-10,000 sq. ft.
Type 3: Outdoor (limited)	10,001 sq. ft. − 1 acre
Type 3A: Indoor (limited)	10,001 – 22,000 sq. ft.
Type 3B: Mixed Light (limited)	10,001 – 22,000 sq. ft.
Type 4: Nursery	Unlimited immature plants, clones, seeds
Type 5: Outdoor (2023)	Greater than 1 acre

State License Types: Distributor

Type 11: Distributor

Distribution and transport of cannabis and cannabis products

- Licensed and bonded
- Transporter and electronic manifest
- Security requirements



State License types: Manufacturing

Type 6: Manufacturer 1	Creation of products using non-volatile solvents* or no solvents
Type 7: Manufacturer Level 2	Creation of products using volatile solvents*

*Volatile solvent: "solvent that is or produces a flammable gas vapor that, when present in the air in sufficient quantities, will create explosive or ignitable mixtures." H&S 11362.3(b)(3)



State License Types: Testing Labs

Type 8: Testing Laboratories

Accredited lab testing for potency, various compounds and contaminants.

- No financial interest in other license types
- Sampling & destruction protocol
- Testing prior to distribution to sales outlets



State License Types: Retailer

Type 10: Retailer

Sales and delivery of cannabis, with or without a retail store-front

- Use of cannabis on-site
- Delivery-only dispensary
- Requirement for security measures, reconciliation, and mandated reporting of suspected theft or diversion



State License Types: Microbusiness

Type 12: Microbusiness*

Cultivator of less than 10,000 sq. ft., distributor, level 1 manufacturer, and retailer**

*Have to comply with all individual requirements for components of this license type

** Retailer can be limited to wholesale only/no storefront

Cannabis Ad-Hoc Committee Update

Initial Committee Conclusions:

- Due to lack of urban type infrastructure and services in the Industrial and Commercial areas of unincorporated Solano County, there are limits on the feasibility of allowing large scale cannabis operations.
- Cities within Solano County are either allowing or considering the possibility of allowing commercial types of cannabis operations. Cities are able to meet the utility and infrastructure demands for certain types of cannabis operations.
- Large scale outdoor cultivation has not been supported by the Solano County Farm Bureau.
- Smaller scale operations, such as nurseries and microbusinesses may be better suited in the unincorporated areas.
