WHEREAS, during his tenure, Mr. Huber led the Board of Directors that guided development of NorthBay Healthcare's neo-natal unit; NorthBay Cancer Center, NorthBay Hospice & Bereavement; as well as its stroke, heart and vascular and trauma programs; and

WHEREAS, under his guidance, the organization achieved highly sought-after Magnet Designation for Excellence in Nursing and a partnership with Mayo Clinic Care Network; and

WHEREAS, his three decades of vision and leadership has helped ensure Solano County residents receive access to advanced medicine and compassionate care close to home.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Solano County Board of Supervisors hereby recognizes and commends G. Ben Huber for his contributions to Solano County and for his many years of devoted leadership with NorthBay Healthcare.
