- The CIP supports renewal & improvement of:
 - 51 buildings/support facilities
 - Approximately 2.1 million square feet maintained by General Services Department



CIP Guiding Principles

- Balance prioritized need with available funding
- Effectively utilize facility and real estate assets
- Renew facilities to extend useful life
- Sustainable building construction/improvements
- New construction based on operational need
- Dispose of surplus real estate




CIP Prioritization Criteria

- Extend useful life of major building systems (maintenance versus replacement)
- Maintain major building systems to avoid failure/operational disruption
