RESOLUTION OF THE SOLANO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RECOGNIZING MAY 1, 2019 AS WORLD MATERNAL MENTAL HEALTH DAY

WHEREAS, one in five new mothers experience some type of perinatal mood and anxiety disorder worldwide; and

WHEREAS, the California Department of Public Health, Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health reports one in five women who recently gave birth experienced symptoms of depression during and after pregnancy, translating to approximately 100,000 women annually; and

WHEREAS, women who are Black or Latina are more likely to have prenatal and postpartum symptoms of depression; however, these women are less likely to receive the care needed; and

WHEREAS, increasing awareness will drive social change with a goal of improving the quality of care for women experiencing all types of perinatal mood and anxiety disorders, reduce the stigma of maternal mental illness and increase the likelihood women will seek help and receive treatment; and

WHEREAS, Solano County Health and Social Services is committed to addressing maternal mental health issues by raising awareness, developing resources, implementing screening and referral processes and enhancing collaboration; and

WHEREAS, implementation of the evidence-based perinatal depression prevention intervention program, the Fathers and Babies program, and the use of a bilingual Mental Health Clinician, Licensed Clinical Social Worker represent some of the program that support families with mental health services in a culturally and linguistically appropriate manner.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Solano County Board of Supervisors hereby recognizes May 1, 2019 as World Maternal Mental Health Day and urges all residents to support maternal mental health wellness of mothers and families.
