- FY2019/20 proposed solution is to use Solano County 1991
 Public Health Realignment funding to cover the shortfall
- FY2020/21 proposed solution for any budget shortfalls both counties will share the cost

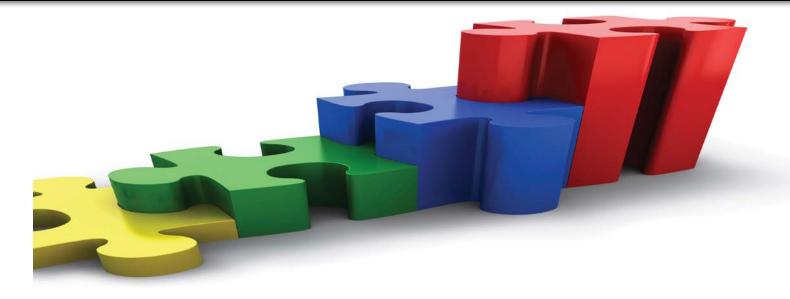
