Director of General Services Mike Lango introduced the item.

Capital Projects Program Manager Mark Hummel provided an overview of the Updated Solano County 5-Year Capital Facilities Improvement Plan for Fiscal years 2017/18 through 2021/22.

Chair Vasquez opened the public hearing.

Chair Vasquez invited members of the public to address the Board on matters not listed on the agenda but within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. The following comments were received:

A) George Guynn, Jr., Suisun City, commented on intended uses of the County Administration Center and availability of funding for projects.

Chair Vasquez commented on the need for maintenance and repairs to keep facilities in good working order.

Chair Vasquez closed the public hearing.

In response to a question from Supervisor Hannigan, Mr. Hummel noted that projects listed for the second year were recommended for funding and that projects shown in further years would be brought forward later for funding recommendations.

Supervisor Hannigan commented in support of the water bottle refilling stations.

Supervisor Thomson commented on a letter received from a concerned veteran about security measures at the Veterans Service Office (VSO) and urged that this be looked into.

County Administrator Birgitta Corsello noted that Facilities, the Building Division and the Sheriff's Office were already working together on this project and would bring this back to the Board.

Supervisor Hannigan suggested that the VSO be moved to the first floor to improve security and provide better access to individuals needing to visit the office.

Supervisor Thomson recommending looking at other departments that have security measures as an example for the VSO.

In response to a question from Supervisor Spering, Ms. Corsello noted that securing the lobby for the VSO was already being looked into and advised that the department was already working with security on this matter.

Supervisor Thomson commented that the VSO averaged 70 visits per day and advised that a different location may be needed.

In response to a question from Supervisor Spering, Mr. Lango advised that the department wants to make sure building systems are operational at all times to avoid disruptions and failures.

In response to questions from Supervisor Spering, Mr. Hummel confirmed that funding for \$29 million of the total \$65 million had been identified already. Facilities Operations Manager James Kremko provided information on criteria the department used to evaluate the priority of projects. He noted that the goal of maintenance was to maintain equipment to extend the life of the equipment beyond the manufacturer's life expectancy in order to save money.

On motion of Supervisor Hannigan, seconded by Supervisor Spering, the Board adopted the Updated Solano County 5-Year Capital Facilities Improvement Plan for Fiscal Years 2017/18 through 2021/22. So ordered by 5-0 vote.
