DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:

Supervisor Seifert and Supervisor Spering request that the Board of Supervisors adopt and present resolutions recognizing Michelle Labelle-Fisch as Solano County Teacher of the Year 2014 and Phillip Green as Classified School Employee of the Year 2014.

SUMMARY/ DISCUSSION:

Twenty-four percent of residents in Solano County are under 18 years of age; a quality education can enrich and expand their lives in many ways, including employment opportunities, civic and political involvements, and the quality of their personal lives. Education gives people critical skills and tools to help them better provide for themselves and can create opportunities for sustainable and viable economic growth now and into the future.

In 1978, Solano County began recognizing exemplary teachers resulting in the annual selection of a teacher who reflects the rich diversity of Solano County's educators. The program pays tribute to Solano's teaching force, the growing complexity of challenges that confront our schools, and the need to promote collaboration and teamwork among teachers to meet those challenges. Recognizing the Solano County Teacher of the Year brings awareness to the pivotal role teachers play and attracts new people to the field.

The Classified School Employee of the Year Program is designed to highlight the contributions of classified school employees who support the education of our public school students in preschool through grade twelve. The overall purpose of the CSEY Program is to pay tribute to the tireless efforts of our outstanding classified school employees. They are vital members who play key roles in creating a school environment that promotes student achievement, safety, and health.
