

# *Resolution No. 2026-*

## **RESOLUTION WITHDRAWING SOLANO COUNTY FROM THE SOLANO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES COOPERATIVE JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY**

**WHEREAS**, the Solano Emergency Medical Services Cooperative (SEMSC) Joint Powers Authority (JPA) was established by agreement among participating agencies to coordinate emergency medical services within Solano County; and

**WHEREAS**, the JPA provides that any member agency may withdraw from it upon providing the required advance written notice; and

**WHEREAS**, on December 2, 2025, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 25-973 amending Chapter 7.1 of the Solano County Code relating to the Local Emergency Medical Services Agency (LEMSA), which removed the SEMSC JPA as the designated LEMSA and transferred all associated authority and responsibilities to Solano County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Solano County Board of Supervisors (Board) has evaluated the County's governance needs related to emergency medical services and determined that withdrawal from the SEMSC JPA is in the best interest of Solano County and its residents; and

**WHEREAS**, because Solano County has already assumed the powers, functions, and responsibilities previously exercised by the SEMSC JPA, the County's formal withdrawal from the SEMSC JPA is required to complete the transition outlined in the JPA and the amendments to Chapter 7.1.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Solano County Board of Supervisors hereby provides formal notice of withdrawal from the Solano Emergency Medical Services Cooperative Joint Powers Authority, effective twelve (12) months from the date of this Resolution.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the County Administrator, in coordination with County Counsel, is authorized and directed to:

- Provide written notice to all member agencies and stakeholders of the County's withdrawal.
- Coordinate the orderly transition of responsibilities, operations, assets, and obligations consistent with the Joint Powers Agreement; and
- Prepare and file any documentation necessary to complete the withdrawal process.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the County Administrator shall provide periodic updates to the Board regarding the progress of dissolution activities and ensure that the transition is completed in a transparent and timely manner.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
