RESOLUTION OF THE SOLANO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RECOGNIZING APRIL 14, 2026, AS YOM HASHOAH, HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY

WHEREAS, the Holocaust was a tragedy of unprecedented scale, the likes of which the world had never before witnessed; and

WHEREAS, from 1933 to 1945, six million Jews were systematically persecuted and murdered by the Nazi regime as part of a deliberate program of genocide, and millions of others also perished as victims of Nazism; and

WHEREAS, the year 2026 marks the 93rd anniversary of the beginning of the genocide of European Jews, one of the darkest and most devastating chapters in human history; and

WHEREAS, April 14, 2026, marks the international observance of Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, a time to mourn and honor the memory of the millions who were lost; and

WHEREAS, the Holocaust stands as one of the darkest periods in human history and must be remembered to help prevent such atrocities from occurring again anywhere in the world; and

WHEREAS, we must educate our children and future generations about the Holocaust, and recognize that the individual and collective acts of courage and resistance during this time serve as enduring examples of how people can and must respond to hatred and injustice; and

WHEREAS, we recommit ourselves to being a light in times of darkness by upholding the principles of human rights, individual freedom, and equal protection under the law in a just and democratic society.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Solano County joins people around the world in observing Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, and in mourning and honoring the memory of the millions who perished during the Holocaust.
